

2023–2024 QUICK STEP PLUS COLLEGE ALGEBRA ENROLLMENT GUIDE FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

QSPCA is an independent study self-paced course, not a College Now course. Your college credit is determined by assessment of the course material by a JCCC professor. To earn college credit, complete the steps below.

1. APPLY for admission only one time regardless of how many semesters you take classes at JCCC. Go to admissions.jccc.edu to start your application. You can upload an unofficial copy of your high school transcript to your application. Consider downloading it before you start the application. For new students, to ensure your eligibility to enroll before the deadline, apply no later than the priority date listed on the calendar on the next page. When your application is processed, you will receive an email that includes your JCCC ID number and login information.

2. PLACEMENT into a College Algebra class. You can place into College Algebra if you have one of the following:

- 1) a grade of “B” or higher in the final semester of a high school course identified as equivalent to or higher than Algebra II and a high school unweighted GPA of 3.00 or higher
- 2) an ACT math score of 20 and a high school unweighted GPA of 3.00 or higher
- 3) an ACT math score of 21 or higher
- 4) an appropriate score on the Accuplacer math placement test

Go to jccc.edu/QuickStepPlus to submit your high school transcript and/or ACT score report through the “Submit Documentation” button or Schedule Placement Test if you need to take the Accuplacer placement test with Testing Services.

3. ENROLL in classes online, by phone, or in person.

For enrollment DEADLINE DATES, see calendar on the next page.

- To enroll online, first you will need the appropriate five-digit CRN that can be found in the table.
- Log in to MyJCCC and click the green Add/Drop Classes button. Select the term “Credit Fall” for fall semester/yearlong courses.
- Select the **Enter CRNs** tab on the top left, enter the five-digit CRN number for your course, click Add, then click Agree & Submit.
- Confirm that your courses show a status of “Registered” to ensure your enrollment was successful.

4. PAY tuition at the time of enrollment. Tuition may be paid online by logging in to MyJCCC and selecting the My Finances tab. No payments can be accepted by phone. Students are financially responsible for all charges on their account. For more information about paying tuition, tuition rates and student financial responsibility, go to jccc.edu/WaysToPay.

2	Application priority submission deadline
2	Last day to upload high school transcript to obtain a course placement waiver
2	Last day to upload ACT scores to obtain a course placement waiver
6	Deadline to complete Accuplacer test, if applicable
6	Last day to enroll in a Quick Step Plus College Algebra course
23	Last day to drop a Quick Step Plus College Algebra course and receive a 100% refund

NOVEMBER 2023

6	Last day to drop a Quick Step Plus College Algebra course without a withdrawal "W" on student's permanent record
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MARCH 2024

1	Last day to withdraw with a "W" on transcript or request pass/fail grade option
