The B.S. degree in Secondary Education requires a minimum of 120 hours. *Only half the hours for a K-State degree can be taken at a two-year college.*

All programs consist of coursework in General Education, a Teaching Field, and Teacher Education. The General Education component is shown below. One of the following Secondary Education teaching fields must be selected: Art (PK-12), Biology, Business, Chemistry, Earth and Space Science, English, English and Journalism, Journalism, Mathematics, Modern Languages (PK-12), Physical Education/Health (PK-12), Physics, Social Studies, Speech, Teacher Education program are also available from Agriculture, Family and Consumer Sciences, Early Childhood, and Music. Refer to the College of Education undergraduate website (coe.k-state.edu) for specific degree requirements and to the K-State transfer equivalency site to check course transferability (go.k-state.edu/equiv). Due to the wide variations and complexity of the coursework, it is recommended students consult with a K-State College Of Education academic advisor to plan transfer classes applicable to their chosen teaching field or refer to the transfer pathways go.k- state.edu/pathways. Additional courses may be available at Johnson County Community College to satisfy teaching field requirements.

Admission to Teacher Education is required for the Professional component of the Teacher Education courses. Transfer students who have completed all the following admission requirements may apply at the time of initial enrollment.

- Secondary Education requires 50 total hours completed, including all transfer and K-State credits.
- Grades of "C" or better in Expository Writing I and II, Public Speaking, College Algebra or a higher level of mathematics and Statistics.
- A 2.75^ GPA is required in coursework applied to the education degree.
- A 2.75[^] average GPA in all teaching field coursework.

^To calculate GPA, the College of Education uses all attempted credits and grades.

- Early Field Experience is completed in EDCI 230. (K-State requires at least 40 documented hours of classroom observations).
- A composite ACT score of 22 or higher is required for admission to preprofessional studies in Teacher Education. All applicants, including transfer students, are required to submit ACT scores, including the composite score as well as scores in reading and mathematics. Applicants with an ACT score below 22 can be admitted to preprofessional studies in Teacher Education provisionally on the basis of evidence of potential success in the program and as a K-12 teacher. Provisional admission can be lifted upon completion of all other requirements for full admission to Teacher Education. Applicants who have never taken the ACT can be admitted provisionally for one semester pending submission of an ACT score.

Professional Component

Kansas State University requires all graduates to meet the K-State 8 General Education requirements as part of their program. The K-State 8 encourages students to explore coursework from 8 different perspectives. The College of Education curriculum meets all 8 requirements in our General Education, Teacher Education and Area of Concentration coursework.
