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The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners well with the first two years of most bachelor's degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and lower division requirements for a bachelor's degree at four-year institutions. The elective hours within the A.A. allow students to complete additional general education and lower division courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 60 credit hours; please see <u>JCCC A.A. degree requirements</u>, the maximum number of hours from a community college that will be applied toward a bachelor's degree at most four-year schools is 64. **Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of appropriate courses.**

- The Community Health program prepares individuals for positions in county, state and federal health departments, non-profit agencies, private ventures or agencies focusing on health promotion, corporate wellness, crisis intervention, drug/alcohol recovery, adoption, or the elderly.
- Students can be admitted into the Community Health program as transfer students if they are admitted to KU, declare Community Health as their major, and meet the following criteria:
 - A KU + Transfer Cumulative GPA of at least 2.75
- For information about initial admission to KU, visit the <u>Office of Admissions</u>. Visit the <u>Office of International Support</u> Services for information about international admissions.
- Prospective Community Health students should consult an advisor early in the first year to plan efficient programs of study.
- Sixty-four credits may be transferred to KU from community colleges. Students should beaware that 45 junior/senior credit hours are required for completion of the bachelor's degree; 30 of those hours must be at KU; and community college courses do not transfer as junior/senior hours.
- A student must earn at least a grade of "C-" or higher in COMS 130, ENGL 101, ENGL 102 and Mathematics requirements. Some programs may have additional minimum grade point requirements for specific classes. Consult School of Education & Human Sciences advisors for details.
- To be eligible for the B.S.E. degree, a student must complete at least 30 hours at KU and at least 30 hours after being admitted to the School of Education & Human Sciences. Up to 6 hours of work done at another institution may be accepted as part of the last 30 hours.
- Only 6 hours of Credit/No Credit is allowed before a student is admitted into the School of Education and Human Sciences. Once admitted, a student cannot take a class Credit/No Credit for any program requirement.
- Classes cannot be used to satisfy both the required minor and social science/humanities prerequisite requirements.
- Minimum total hours for graduation is 120.
- KU Core Requirements The KU Core comprises three general education goals and three advanced education goals. The general education goals are best met early in a student's career. The advanced education goals are most appropriately acquired using the foundation of knowledge gained from the general education goals and progression through the major. Courses can be used to satisfy one Core goal at a time but may satisfy a major requirement and a core goal. Students that complete the A.A. at JCCC meet the KU Core Goals 1-3.
