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The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners well with the first two years of most bachelor's degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and lower division requirements for a bachelor's degree at four-year institutions. The 30 hours of electives within the A.A. allow students to complete additional general education and lower division courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 60 credit hours; please see <a href="JCCC A.A. degree requirements">JCCC A.A. degree requirements</a>. The maximum number of hours from a community college that will be applied toward a bachelor's degree at KU is 64. Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of appropriate courses.

- The secondary History & Government education program prepares individuals to become teachers in 6-12<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms through rigorous content and field experiences.
- Students can be admitted into teacher education programs as transfer students if they are admitted to KU, declare a teacher education program as their major, and meet the following criteria:
  - A KU + Transfer Cumulative GPA of at least 2.75
- Transition Point #1: Progression to the Professional Block 1 requires that all Pre-Professional coursework is completed with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75. Must consult with an advisor before entering the Professional Block. Students must complete the following:
  - Declare intent to continue in teacher education program and enter the professional sequence.
  - Earn a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.75.
  - Clear a criminal background check prior to placement in schools.
  - Complete the non-academic factor survey.
  - Administrative review of GPA in Prerequisite Courses. Students must have 2.50 GPA in the KU Core Curriculum and General Education courses.
  - Administrative review of dispositions for any concerns.

- A maximum of 64 hours may be transferred to KU from community colleges. Students should be aware that 45 junior/senior credit hours are required for completion of the bachelor's degree; 30 of those hours must be at KU; and community college courses do not transfer as junior/senior hours. A student must earn at least a grade of "C-" or higher in COMS 130, ENGL 101, English and Mathematics requirements. A grade lower than a "C-" is not acceptable in any teacher education course. Some programs may have additional minimum grade point requirements for specific classes.
- For History & Government, English, and Foreign Language: A 2.5 minimum grade-point average in content area courses.
- Only 6 hours of Credit/No Credit is allowed before a student is admitted into the School of Education and Human Sciences. Once admitted, a student cannot take a class Credit/No Credit for any program requirement.
- Minimum total hours for graduation is 121.

## **KU Core Requirements**

The KU Core comprises three general education goals and three advanced education goals. The general education goals are best met early in a student's career. The advanced education goals are most appropriately acquired using the foundation of knowledge gained from the general education goals and progression through the major. Courses can be used to satisfy one Core goal at a time but may satisfy a major requirement and a core goal. Students that complete the A.A. at JCCC meet the KU Core Goals 1-3.
