**Transfer Admission Procedures/Qualifications**

**Application:**

- Application is available on-line at <http://www.webster.edu/admissions/apply-now.html> or at the campus.
- \$50 nonrefundable application fee is required, payable on-line by credit card.
- An official transcript submitted directly from each college, university or other post-secondary institution attended showing all work attempted to date.

Webster accepts electronic transcripts if sent as official through services such as Parchment, National Student Clearinghouse, or eScript-Safe, or if sent through a secure server directly from the institution. These should be sent to [transcripts@webster.edu](mailto:transcripts@webster.edu) if an email address is requested. Email attachments are not considered official.

- Students may apply any time; Webster University – Kansas City’s terms begin in January, March, June, August, and October. We offer evening classes, online and, occasionally Saturday classes.
- Transfer students are welcome to visit the campus during regular business hours, Monday – Thursday 8:30 A.M. - 6 P.M., Fridays 8:30 A.M. – 2:00 P.M..

**International Students:**

**Readmission:**

- A Webster University student who is in good standing, has earned credits but has stopped out for one year or more must apply for readmission. Coursework taken while the student was away from Webster must meet the transfer qualifications below.

**Transfer Qualifications:**

- This is a degree completion program. Students must have 64 credits of college work from a regionally accredited college of university with a 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale) or better GPA.
- For RN’s the minimum GPA acceptable by the Nursing Department is 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
- Courses with a grade of “A”, “B”, “C”, or “D” will transfer as credit; however, courses with the grade of “D” will not count toward general education courses. In the BA - Management, one grade of “D” is acceptable toward core course requirements in the major.
- Courses must be numbered 100 level or above to transfer.
- ACT or SAT scores are not required for transfer students.

- Official evaluation is based on official transcripts from previous accredited institutions.

## Tuition/Fees/Expenses for the 2018-19 Academic Year

### Tuition and Fees:

- RN-BSN on-line courses are \$350 per credit hour.
- Part-time undergraduate tuition courses are \$490 per credit hour.
- Undergraduate *on-line* courses are \$710 per credit hour.
- Textbook costs vary, depending on the course.
- There is a \$50 graduation fee.

## Financial Aid/Scholarship

### Application Deadline:

- Students may apply for Financial Aid in the form of loans at any time of the year.
- For Pell grants (need-based) the preferred deadline is March 1. Other grants may be available if the student is a dependent.
- When filling out the FAFSA, Webster's code is #002521.

## Transfer Credit/Grading Policies

### Application of Credit:

- The BA or BSN at Webster requires 128 credits, 2.0 on a 4.0 scale GPA or better (2.5 for Nursing), and completion of general education requirements and the core courses in the major.
- The Associate in Arts (A.A.) degree meets all Webster University's general education requirements.
- The Associate in Science (A.S.), Associate in Applied Science (A.P.S.), and Associate in Fine Arts (A.F.A.) degrees generally meet between three and six of the nine general education requirements; students may finish their general education courses at Webster.
- Students may transfer up to 64 credit hours from a community college (two-year school) and 98 credit hours from a senior college (four-year school). Beyond the Associate of Arts (or A.A.S., A.S., A.F.S.), additional transfer credits are restricted.
- Other transfer credits may be acceptable such as standardized tests (CLEP, DANTES, etc.), and/or extra-institutional credits (military and corporate training recognized by the American Council of Education) or Prior Learning Assessment for example.
- Webster's residency requirement is a minimum of 30 of the last 36 credits before graduation must be completed at Webster.
