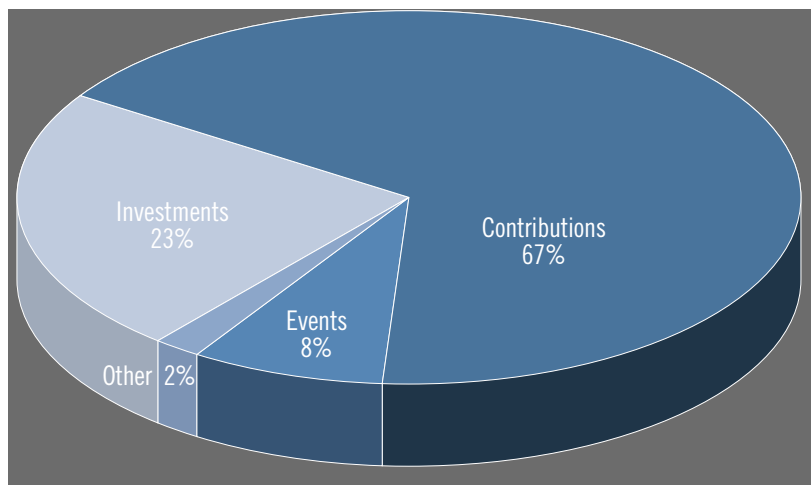




JCCC FOUNDATION 2018-2019 IN REVIEW

Total Income: \$7,313,854



Through expansive fundraising efforts, the JCCC Foundation supports student scholarships, programs and cultural arts at the College. Here's a look at some of this year's highlights:

New Scholarships

\$123,000 from the **Phillip A. and Betty M. Calabrese Trust** to establish a new general student scholarship.

The **Child Care Access Fund Scholarship** was established through a multiyear partnership between the U.S. Department of Education and the JCCC Foundation. This scholarship provides financial support for students with children enrolled in our state-licensed and nationally accredited Hiersteiner Child Development Center.

The **Better Tomorrow Fund** was established with a **\$25,000** gift through the JCCC Foundation. It was specifically designed for individuals exiting the corrections system who want to complete Continuing Education courses.

Gala Sensation

Annual black-tie gala **Some Enchanted Evening** set records with nearly 800 attendees helping raise **\$800,000** for scholarships.

Meeting Student Needs

\$30,000 was available for student resources including the **Counseling Center Hardship Grant** and **JCCC's MealSHARE** program.

Appealing to the Senses

\$125,000 was received from the **Jedel Family Trust** for Nerman Museum of Contemporary Art acquisitions, arts education and programming.

Nearly **\$130,000** was donated by the **Friends of the Carlsen Center**, in gifts, grants and sponsorships to support Carlsen Center programming.



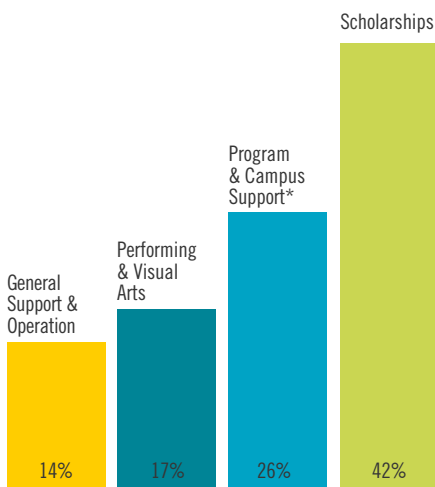

More than **\$1.2 million** awarded to JCCC students for books, tuition and programming.

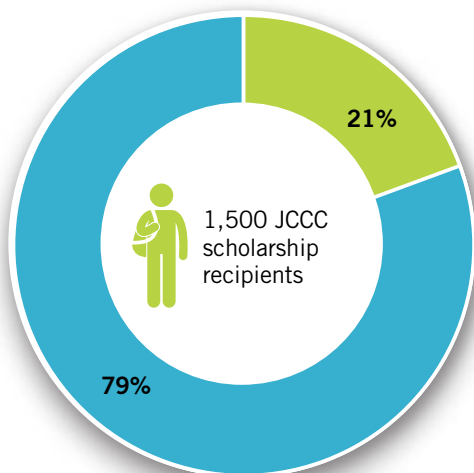
Nearly **1,500 students** received Foundation scholarships.
