

Staff in the Office of Grants Leadership and Development provide an array of services to help faculty and staff plan for a grant submission, prepare grant proposals, and administer an approved grant.



Highlights of Active Grants

\$644,760, National Science Foundation (7/15/16 - 6/30/21)

Scholarships in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (S-STEM) Professors Beth Edmonds and Suneetha Menon lead this project to award scholarships to underrepresented JCCC students whose goal is to major in a STEM field and transfer on to a university.

\$22,546, U.S. Department of Agriculture (9/1/16 – 8/30/18) Secondary Education, Two-Year Postsecondary Education, and Agriculture in the Classroom Challenge Grants Program (SPECA)

Professor Stu Shafer convened high school and college educators, non-profit organizations, practicing farmers, and employers for a two-day conference to explore the need for sustainable agriculture education in Kansas. The conference attendees created a shared Wiki as a resource in developing a 2-year degree pathway in sustainable agriculture.

\$2,496,764, U.S. Department of Labor (10/1/14 – 9/30/18)

Trade Adjustment Assistance Community College and Career Training (TAACCCT)Led by Deb Elder, Assistant Dean of Computer Science and Information Technology, this project supported piloting and evaluating competency-based curriculum in CSIT programs. Additionally, students entering one of these programs received career coaching to design customized educational plans.

\$273,093, U.S. Department of State (3/1/16 - 2/28/18)

Academic Linkages and Education Programs

The International Education and Study Abroad Office coordinated a semester-long program, bringing 6 faculty from our partner institution in Pakistan, Sukkur Institute for Business Administration, to be mentored by JCCC faculty and staff. The mentoring Sukkur staff received help in advancing their initiatives in Distance Learning, Learning Center Pedagogy, Early Childhood Education, and Program Assessment.



Highlights of New Grants Awarded

\$67,485, U.S. Department of Transportation (9/30/17 - 9/30/18)

Commercial Motor Vehicle (CMV) Operator Safety Training

Overseen by Josh Smith, Program Director in Continuing Education, JCCC provided scholarships to 15 veterans and/or their family members to complete the CDL-A program. These graduates also received job placement services into a professional truck driving position.

\$7,457, U.S. Department of Justice (10/26/17 - 8/31/19)

Bulletproof Vest Partnership (BVP) Program

Supporting our JCCC police officers, this grant program provided funds to reimburse a portion of the cost of replacing 25 bulletproof vests.

\$295,951, National Science Foundation (12/1/17 - 11/30/20)

Fostering a Community of Scholarship Among Community College STEM Faculty Through Support of Discipline-Based Education Research

Professors Heather Seitz and Jean Ann Vickers lead this project to train 18 STEM faculty in discipline-based education research (DBER). Out of this training, the STEM faculty will pilot evidence-based teaching practices in their classrooms and publish/ present on the results.
