If you must chew gum or suck on candy, unwrap your goodie before the lights go out.

Please do not talk during the performance. Laugh, cry, guffaw, weep, sniffle, chuckle or gasp instead. We like those things.

Feet belong on the floor, not on the seats or rails in front of you.

A word about children: In consideration of other audience members, we ask you not to bring children age 12 or younger to any of our productions (except for the children's play). Please ask the house manager if you have guestions regarding the play's content.

If you are a friend or family member of a cast or crew member, we invite you to meet with them in the lobby following the performance.
