

2019-2020 QUICK STEP PLUS COLLEGE ALGEBRA ENROLLMENT GUIDE FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

QSPCA is an independent study self-paced course, not a College Now course. Your college credit is determined by assessment of the course material by a JCCC professor. To earn college credit, complete the steps below.

- 1. APPLY** for admission only one time regardless of how many semesters you take classes at JCCC. Go to **admissions.jccc.edu** to start your application.
For new students, to ensure your eligibility to enroll before the deadline, apply no later than the priority date listed on the calendar on the next page. When your application is processed, you will receive an email that includes your JCCC ID number and login information.
- 2. TEST** into your College Algebra course or submit appropriate ACT math score of 22 or higher. Required testing must be completed prior to enrollment. Go to **jccc.edu/testing** for information on Testing Services location, hours, procedures on how to submit ACT scores, placement tests and test prep materials. Students who need disability accommodation for the placement test may contact Access Services at accessservices@jccc.edu.
- 3. ENROLL** in classes online, by phone, or in person.
For enrollment DEADLINE DATES, see calendar on the next page.
 - To enroll online, first you will need the appropriate five-digit CRN that can be found in the table.
 - Log in to MyJCCC and click the green Add/Drop Classes button. Select the term “Credit Fall” for fall semester/yearlong courses
 - Select the **Enter CRNs** tab on the top left, enter the five-digit CRN number for your course, click Add, then click Agree & Submit.
 - Confirm that your courses show a status of “Registered” to ensure your enrollment was successful.
- 4. PAY** tuition at the time of enrollment. Tuition may be paid online by logging in to MyJCCC and selecting the My Finances tab or in person at the Bursar’s Office. No payments can be accepted by phone. Students are financially responsible for all charges on their account.

September 2019

- 27 Application priority submission deadline
ACT test score priority submission deadline, if applicable

October 2019

- 4 Fall enrollment deadline: Quick Step Plus College Algebra
Accuplacer and/or ACT test score deadline
- 21 Last day to drop with 100% refund

November 2019

- 4 Last day to drop without a "W" on transcript

March 2020

- 2 Last day to withdraw with a "W" on transcript or request
pass/fail grade option
