- 1) Call to order
  - President Tiger Harris-Webster called the General Assembly to order at 12:05 pm
- 2) Adoption of Agenda
  - Vice President Caleb Keltner made a motion to amend the agenda and add New Senators to the New Business section. Senator Yodit Teklit seconded it, and the motion passed with all votes in favor
  - Senator Julia Fraley made a motion to adopt the minutes and agenda, and senator Caroline Beardall seconded it. The motion passed with all votes in favor.

- 5) New Business
  - New Senator – Dierick Otiankouya introduced herself to the senate. She has had past leadership experiences as she is manager of the business club at JCCC, and she used to be French Club president in high school. She speaks three languages, and is interested in marketing and psychology. President Tiger Harris- Webster and Vice President Caleb Keltner talked to her about Student Senate in the past.
    - i. She got voted in with all 19 votes in favor.
  - Budget Request – The Interior Student Design Association had a budget request of \$3,640. On April 25<sup>th</sup> they will have an event called Dessert Delight. In this event, the members of IDSA will be able to showcase their work while being critiqued by ten professionals in their fields. The Budget Committee recommended allocating them 83.7% of their request, which is a total of \$3,046.68
    - i. Senator Julia Fraley motioned to accept the recommendation of the Budget Committee, Senator Caroline Beardall seconded it. The motion passed with all votes in favor.
  - Voting to collaborate with Faculty on gathering student need information – This consists of gathering information of what resources are available to students, and what is being used and what is not being used.
    - i. Senator Xiao Ren motioned to collaborate with faculty on gathering student information, Senator Julia Fraley seconded the motion. Senators voted all in

favor.

- Impeachment process – Parliamentarian Ankeet Prasai started the impeachment process for Ilesha Davenport and Kimberlyn Crane.
  - i. Ilesha Davenport had many unexcused absences as well as Kimberlyn Crane who was no longer enrolled at the school.
  - ii. Senators voted 19 in favor and 1 against to impeach Kimberlyn Crane.
  - iii. Senators voted 19 in favor and 1 against to impeach Ilesha Davenport.

#### 7) Committee Reports

- Vice Chair Chris Bergin gave the Budget committee report. They had a budget request from IDSA.
