#### What is CLEAR?

College Learning Experiences, Activities and Resources provides continuing education classes for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. The program, sponsored by JCCC, is designed to teach independent living skills and provide life-enhancing experiences. Clear Saturdays are offered through the Supported Education Programs Department.

#### **Registration is Easy**

If you have attended CLEAR classes before, simply return the registration form with your payment of fees. Class offerings are on a first-come, first served basis. New students must call the CLEAR office at 913-469-7890 for an enrollment interview.

#### **Reasonable Fees**

The registration fee is \$5 for each seven-week class. Refund requests must be received four days prior to the start of classes.

#### **Drop-off and Pick-up Location**

Students should be dropped off and picked up in front of the Student Center. The Student Center is located on the northwest side of campus off of College Boulevard. Please use the Circle Drive or the accessible parking in front of the Student Center.

Students may be dropped off no earlier than 9:15 a.m. Please make arrangements for PROMPT pick-up at 3 p.m. Any late arrivals or early dismissals must be coordinated by students, guardians and/or transportation staff.

#### **Bring or Buy Your Lunch**

You may bring money and buy your lunch at the Food Court or you may bring a sack lunch from home. Updated menus including prices will be sent with students' schedules.

#### **Showcase Performance Classes**

These classes will participate in the performance at the end of the session. Each semester, different talents will be highlighted.

#### **Certificate of Completion**

If you attend at least five of the seven class meetings, you will receive a JCCC CLEAR certificate of completion. Fall certificates will be mailed.

#### **Multiple Session Attendance**

Students may initially enroll in one session for each semester; however, they may be able to enroll in both sessions as space allows. After enrolling for your preferred session using this form, contact the office at 913-469-7890 to be placed on a waitlist for the other session.

#### **New Office Location!**


