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- ❖ These requirements are effective for all students whose first enrollment in an accredited college or university occurs in the fall of 2009 or later.
- ❖ Admission to the junior-level Block I portion of the elementary education program requires:
 - a. **GPA of 2.75 or higher** in core courses, noted with a ^ below, and a 2.5 minimum cumulative GPA.
 - b. ACT composite score (22 or better) or minimum ETS Praxis CORE scores of 150 math, 156 reading and 162 writing.
 - c. A grade of “C” or better in English Composition I and II, Public Speaking, Introduction to Teaching, Children’s Literature, Survey of the Exceptional Child, Developmental Psychology, Basic Music, Elementary Health and PE, and Mathematics Courses (marked below with ●).
 - d. At least junior level standing with 50 or more semester hours of general education before Block I courses begin.
 - e. At least 100 hours of supervised work experience with preschool through grade 12 students in schools or agencies that work with youth in advocacy roles.
 - f. An Application to Block I form submitted to the respective (KC or Emporia) Elementary Education Advising Office by March 1 for the Summer or Fall Block I and October 1 for the Spring Block I. Admission to Teacher Education Requirements does not need to be met prior to submitting application; however, the requirements must be met prior to enrollment in Block I.
 - g. Five references on file, one each from the following courses: EDUC 121, EDUC 220, EL 150 or EL 250, EL 312 and EL 350.
 - h. Health clearance completed and turned in (TB test and physical).
- ❖ Requirements for the Elementary (K-6) Education major include a minimum of 120 credit hours
- ❖ In addition to the Elementary Education licensure (K-6), licensure may be obtained, with additional hours, in the following areas: ESL, Middle Level Subject Areas (Math, English, Social Science, and Science)
- ❖ ESU provides an Elementary Education program in the Kansas City area through Johnson County Community College. See below, www.emporia.edu/distance/eled/jccc or contact Ashley Udell at the above for additional information about this completion program.
- ❖ **JCCC Program specific info**
 - a. The classes are offered in the late afternoon and evenings with a few courses offered online. This allows the student to plan around daytime family and work schedules. During the final year, students will need to be available from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. for the PDS placement.
 - b. Course offerings, degree completion, licensure and other requirements for students in this program at JCCC are the same as required of all ESU students. Elementary Education Cohort applications are accepted for fall and spring entries. The priority deadlines for application are September 15 for the spring semester and February 15 for the fall semester. Students must be admitted to ESU to qualify for admission to the Elementary Education Cohort Program.
 - c. Under the new lockstep Cohort Program, dual admission is not encouraged. Students should complete the courses through JCCC before entering the Emporia program.
