

Johnson County Community College Transfer Program to the University of Kansas **Edwards Campus** JOHNSON COUNTY School of Social Welfare, Bachelor of Social Work 2023-2024 Catalog

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The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners well with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and lower division requirements for a bachelor's degree at four-year institutions. The 30 elective hours within the A.A. allow students to complete additional general education and lower division courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 60 credit hours; please see JCCC A.A. degree requirements. Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of appropriate courses.

- Step One: Admission to the University of Kansas Students are directly admitted to the School of Social Welfare as new freshman and transfer students. Incoming students must first apply for admission to the University of Kansas. The application may be completed at admissions.ku.edu. Students must submit official college transcripts from all colleges and universities previously attended. Transfer students must have a 2.5 cumulative GPA and at least 24 transferable credit hours. Being admitted does not guarantee permission to enroll in social welfare courses. Students must complete the Advancement Review before being able to take 500-level coursework. For scholarship consideration, apply to KU by May 1<sup>st</sup> prior to the summer/fall semester or December 1<sup>st</sup> prior to the spring semester you plan to transfer to KU.
- Step Two: Admission to the KU School of Social Welfare For students to advance into the 500-level coursework, they must complete and pass the BSW Advancement Review which is due July 31<sup>st</sup>. Students will gain access to the Advancement Review portal after being admitted through Step One above. The Advancement Review includes the following:
  - 54 hours of general education coursework (see below) including completion of ENGL 101, ENGL 102, and MATH 101 or LA&S 108
  - Earned grade of B or higher in SW 220 (B- not accepted)
  - Minimum transferrable cumulative GPA of 2.50
  - One reference from a professional or academic reference. Personal or character references are not accepted. Form is found in Advancement Review portal
  - Electronically signed copies of BSW Student Standards and Advancement Policies and Procedures, NASW Code of Ethics, and the KU Code of Student Rights and Responsibilities
- A maximum of 75 community college credit hours can be applied toward a bachelor's degree at KU Edwards. Contact your KU Edwards academic success coach for more information. A minimum of 120 credit hours of coursework, including 12 credit hours of field practicum, is required for graduation. At least 30 credit hours must be taken at KU; 45 junior/senior level credit hours are required.
- Pass/Fail Policy Not allowable for any required SW (prefix) courses.
- Students may complete the BSW degree on the Lawrence campus in courses offered during the daytime. Late afternoon and evening courses meet on Tuesdays and Thursdays at the KU Edwards campus. Social work major courses are not offered online. The major is identical on both Lawrence and Edwards Campuses; only the times the courses are offered differ.

KU Core Requirements The KU Core comprises three general education goals and three advanced education goals. The general education goals are best met early in a student's career. The advanced education goals are most appropriately acquired using the foundation of knowledge gained from the general education goals and progression through the major. Courses can be used to satisfy one Core goal at a time, but may satisfy a major requirement and a core goal.
