

Johnson County Community College Transfer Program to the University of Missouri School of Journalism Journalism, B.J. 2023-24 Catalog

The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners well with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and lower division requirements for a bachelor's degree at four-year institutions. The 33 hours of electives within the A.A. allow students to complete additional general education and lower division courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 60 credit hours; please see JCCC A.A. degree requirements. The maximum number of hours from a community college that will be applied toward a bachelor's degree at most four-year schools is between 60 and 63 credit hours or 50% of the degree. Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of appropriate courses.

**Transfer Admission Requirements** - Admission to Mizzou does not guarantee admission to the journalism degree program. At the time of application to Mizzou, students interested in journalism are first considered for general admission to MU and then for admission to pre-journalism or undeclared journalism. Admitted students are considered pre-journalism or undeclared journalism until they apply to a journalism career path.

## Admission to Mizzou –

- Transfer students who meet MU's freshman admission requirements (<u>https://admissions.missouri.edu/</u>) must have a minimum 2.5 transfer GPA in college-level courses to be admitted.
  - Transfer students who do not meet MU's freshman admission requirements must have:
    - A minimum of 24 transferable college-level credits;
    - A 2.5 GPA in transferable college-level courses; and
    - Either College Algebra with a C- or better or the equivalent to MU's English 1000 with a C- or better. All students in the School of Journalism are required to earn a B- or better in ENGL 1000 or an equivalent course.

Admission to Undeclared Journalism - Transfer students who meet the minimum MU admissions standards and meet both of the following levels of criteria can be admitted to the School of Journalism as an undeclared journalism major. Students must have either been in the top 10% of their High School graduating class or have a composite score of 29 on the ACT or 1290 on the SAT. Students must also earn a minimum cumulative transfer GPA of 3.0 in their college course work.

## A UM System cumulative GPA of 3.0 and completion of prerequisite coursework with a minimum of Callow students to matriculate into career path coursework including: Television, Cross-Platform Editing and Producing, Photojournalism and Documentary, Reporting and Writing, Social and Audience Strategy, and Strategic Communication.

Admission to a Journalism Career Path - Students who wish to apply for admission to a journalism career path are required to meet all of the following requirements:

- Will have completed 60 credits before beginning interest area courses.
- Will have completed all pre-interest area course requirements.
- Must have a minimum UM System cumulative GPA of 2.65 to apply for an interest area. A GPA of 3.0 or higher is required for automatic acceptance.
- Students whose primary language is not English are required to meet specific criteria before seeking enrollment in any journalism course and program admission.

Completion of at least two to three semesters at MU is required for transfer students to establish an MU GPA and qualify for full admission to the major. Because of that, *students who plan to major in journalism are encouraged to transfer to Missouri after taking no more than 30 credit hours elsewhere.* Students who transfer to Mizzou without any lower-division journalism courses will need a minimum of two or three semesters to complete the lower-division journalism courses.

**Undergraduate (University) Requirements** - Undergraduate students must complete all University requirements as well as all requirements specified for the degree(s) and major(s), and requirements of the college or school, and department offering the degree. This would include the University general education requirements as well as the following:

- A second MU Writing Intensive course (must be completed with a grade of C- or better) must be completed in a student's major. It needs to be a 3000/4000 level MU WI course approved as part of the curriculum by the faculty of a student's major.
- Complete an approved capstone course\* with MU course work in the student's major.
- Complete 30 of the last 36 credits with MU authored courses.
- Complete no fewer than 120 credit hours of coursework.
- Earn no less than a 2.00 GPA, as defined by the GPA of Record.
- Pass the Missouri Higher Education Civics Achievement Examination with a score of seventy percent or greater.

**Major Program Requirements** – The Bachelor of Journalism degree requires 120 credits. The faculty expects each student to maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0 to be considered in good standing. To obtain the Bachelor of Journalism degree, a student must complete the following:

- MU Graduation Requirements see above
- MU General Education see JCCC equivalent below
- Major Core: 27 credit hours no equivalent at JCCC
- Major Career Path: 6 credit hours no equivalent at JCCC
- Major Capstone: 3 credit hours- no equivalent at JCCC
- Major Specialty Areas: 15 credit hours no equivalent at JCCC
- Non-Journalism Electives: 25 credit hours no equivalent at JCCC

It is the STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY to check for updates to all transfer information. This transfer guide is provided as a service and is updated as needed. Degree requirements at the four-year colleges are subject to change by those institutions. To ensure you have the most accurate up to date information about the program, it is imperative you meet with an advisor at the transfer institution.
