



- The minimum number of required General Education semester credit hours for all students, regardless of their program of study, is 42. Some degree programs may require up to six additional hours of General Education depending on the math, science and technology courses required.
- Courses taken to fulfill General Education requirements may not be taken on the pass/fail basis.
- UCM offers a program for certain out-of-state students to receive in-state tuition. This program is called the **Choose Red Grant** and you can find more information here: [ucmo.edu/instate](http://ucmo.edu/instate).
- It is the STUDENT’S RESPONSIBILITY to check for updates to all transfer information. This transfer program is provided as a service and is updated at least annually. Degree requirements at the four-year colleges are subject to change by those institutions.
