Program Outlook



Total employment for Health Technologists in the Kansas City Metro Area was 2,824. Over the past three years, this occupation added 319 jobs in the region and is expected to increase over the next seven years at an annual average rate of 0.9%. The top three hard skills requested: Medical Terminology, Health/Wellness, and Microsoft Excel. The top three soft skills requested: Communication (written and verbal), Customer Service, and Cooperative/Team Player. Typical Entry-Level Education: Postsecondary non-degree award.
