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The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners well with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and lower division requirements for a bachelor's degree at four-year institutions. The elective hours within the A.A. allow students to complete additional general education and lower division courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 60 credit hours. The maximum number of hours from a community college that will be applied toward a bachelor's degree at most four-year schools is 60 to 64 hours. Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of appropriate courses.

University Admission Requirements for Undergraduate Transfers:

If you are a student with 24 transfer credit hours or more, you must:

- Have a minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA (on a 4.0 scale) on all previous college work.

If you are a student under the age of 21, with fewer than 24 transfer credit hours, you must:

- Have a minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA (on a 4.0 scale) on all previous college work *and*
- Meet freshman qualified admissions requirements.

Follow the steps below for getting started at Fort Hays State University:

1. [Apply](#) online for undergraduate admission to FHSU.
2. [Send official transcripts](#) from all previously attended institutions to FHSU Registrar's Office, 600 Park Street, Hays, KS 67601. Military students should also send in their Joint Services Transcript (JST).
3. Apply for [Financial Aid](#) and [Scholarships](#).
4. Once accepted, [set up your FHSU TigerNetID](#) for access to your student account.
5. Contact your academic advisor to pre-enroll.

- Bachelor of Science Degree Requirements: (1) completion of at least 120 hours of credit with a passing grade and a minimum grade average index of 2.00 in all coursework, unless the department specifies a higher grade index; (2) a minimum average grade index of 2.00 in all coursework taken at Fort Hays State University; (3) completion of a major (with a minimum of 30 hours) as specified for the degree sought—with a minimum average grade index of 2.00 for all courses in the signed major, unless the department specifies a higher grade index; (4) completion of general education program (foundation studies, liberal arts and university integrative course requirements; (5) completion of at least 45 hours of credit in upper-division courses numbered 300 and above; and (6) a degree summary signed by academic advisor and submission of written degree application to the Office of the Registrar.

- All program courses must be completed with a “C” or better.
- "Non-restricted" courses below are open to Teacher Education majors who have not yet been admitted to the Teacher Education program (some prerequisites apply). [Admission to Teacher Education](#) is a prerequisite for "Restricted" courses. You're also required to complete General Education courses, and Teacher Education requires you to take specific courses from among the General Education selections.  - Professional Studies & Major Courses (Non-restricted): 20 credit hours
 - Major Courses (Restricted to program admits): 22 credit hours – No equivalent
 - Internships and Methods Courses (Restricted to program admits): 17 credit hours – No equivalent
 - Student Teaching (Restricted to program admits): 12 credit hours – No equivalent
 - A minimum of 120 credit hours are required.
- Elementary Education Program Summary:
 - General Education Coursework: 45 credit hours for Transfer and Articulation Agreement or 48 credit hours for General Education
 - Professional Studies & Major Courses (Non-restricted): 25 credit hours
 - Major Courses (Restricted to program admits): 14 credit hours – No equivalent
 - Internships and Methods Courses (Restricted to program admits): 21 credit hours – No equivalent
 - Student Teaching (Restricted to program admits): 12 credit hours – No equivalent
 - A minimum of 120 credit hours are required.
