



The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners well with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and lower division requirements for a bachelor's degree at four-year institutions. The 30 hours of electives within the A.A. allow students to complete additional general education and lower division courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 60 credit hours; please see [JCCC A.A. degree requirements](#), the maximum number of hours from a community college that will be applied toward a bachelor's degree at most four-year schools. Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of appropriate courses.

- The BFA in Art is a 4-year, 120-credit hour program with concentrations possible in Studio Art or Graphic Design. Areas of focus within the Studio Art BFA include Ceramics, Drawing, Metalsmithing and Jewelry, Painting, Photography, and Printmaking. Student must maintain an overall 2.5 GPA in order to graduate with a BFA degree. This degree is considered appropriate preparation for the Master of Fine Arts degree.
- Formal evaluation of student work prior to admission to a chosen area of concentration is required upon completion of the Department of Art Foundation Core. A presentation of completed foundation coursework will occur during the spring semester when the foundation courses (13 hours) are completed. Visual course work must meet faculty approval, and upon passing the review, students may begin BFA study in the area of concentration they have selected. Student must pass ART 298: Portfolio Review to continue with a BFA degree.
- All K-State students, including transfer students, are required to successfully complete credit-bearing courses/experiences to complete the K-State 8 General Education Program requirements. For information, see <https://www.k-state.edu/kstate8/>. Transfer courses evaluated as equivalent to K-State 8 courses can be applied to meet K-State 8 requirements.
- Students should consult with a JCCC counselor when planning their transfer course work, particularly in the areas of humanities, social sciences and natural sciences, to allow for the university general education course work that must be taken at K-State.

It is the STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY to check for updates to all transfer information. This transfer guide is provided as a service and is updated as needed. Degree requirements at the four-year colleges are subject to change by those institutions. To ensure you have the most accurate up to date information about the program, it is imperative you meet with an advisor at the transfer institution.
