Transfer Program to Kansas State University College of Health and Human Sciences

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The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and lower division requirements for a bachelor's degree at four-year institutions. The 30 hours of electives within the A.A. allow students to complete additional general education and lower division courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 60 credit hours. Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of appropriate courses.

The College of Health and Human Sciences offers a B.S. in Dietetics with two program options, a Coordinated Program and a Didactic Program. The Didactic Program is available on campus and by distance education through K-State's Global Campus. See www.hhs.kstate.edu/fndh/academics/undergraduate/dietetics/ for information about each program option. Both programs are accredited by the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics. All students initially are admitted to Dietetics, and subsequently must apply for admission to either the Coordinated Program or the Didactic Program. Application deadlines and instructions are included on the website.

- Two programs are available in dietetics. Program I is the coordinated program in dietetics, and Program II is the didactic program in dietetics.
- Total credits required for graduation for Coordinated program: 121-124 hours
- Total credits required for graduation for Didactic program in Dietetics (DPD): 120 hours
- Up to half of the credits required for a four-year degree may be completed at accredited two-year colleges.
- Each student must complete at least 30 K-State resident credits to be considered for a degree from K-State.
- A minimum of 45 hours must be at a course level of 300 or higher.
- Students must complete 20 of the last 30 hours of resident credit at K-State.
- Letter grades are required. Courses with "pass" or "credit" in lieu of letter grade can apply only as unrestricted electives.
- Grades of "B" or higher are required in all "Professional Studies" courses and all "Sciences" courses. Grades of "C" or better are required in all other "General Requirement" courses.
- All K-State students, including transfer students, are required to successfully complete creditbearing courses/experiences to complete the K-State 8 General Education Program requirements. For information, see www.k-state.edu/kstate8/. Transfer courses evaluated as equivalent to K-State 8 courses can be applied to meet K-State 8 requirements.
