The B.S. degree in Elementary Education requires a minimum of 120 hours and is offered either on-campus or online. ***Only half the hours for a K-State degree can be taken at a two-year college.***

The program consists of coursework in General Education, an Area of Concentration and Teacher Education. The General Education component is shown below. Additional courses may be available at Johnson County Community College to satisfy some Concentration courses.

This program is also offered online in a cohort format through K-State's Global Campus. Students may do their student teaching in the Kansas City metro area. For more information about the online degree, go to <http://global.k-state.edu/education/elementary-education/>.

Admission Requirements for Teacher Education:

- Elementary Education requires 42 hours completed, including all transfer and K-State credits.
- Grades of "C" or better in Expository Writing I and II, Public Speaking, College Algebra or a higher level of mathematics and Statistics.
- A 2.75 GPA is required in coursework applied to the elementary education degree. To calculate GPA, the College of Education uses all attempted credits and grades.
- A composite ACT score of 22 or higher is required for admission to preprofessional studies in Teacher Education. All applicants, including transfer students, are required to submit ACT scores, including the composite score as well as scores in reading and mathematics. Applicants with an ACT score below 22 can be admitted to preprofessional studies in Teacher Education provisionally on the basis of evidence of potential success in the program and as a K-12 teacher. Provisional admission can be lifted upon completion of all other requirements for full admission to Teacher Education. Applicants who have never taken the ACT can be admitted provisionally for one semester pending submission of an ACT score.
- Early Field Experience is completed in EDCI 230. (K-State requires at least 40 documented hours of classroom observation).

Area of Concentration

The bachelor's degree in Elementary Education requires the completion of an area of concentration of 15 hours in addition to hours completed in the general education component of the degree. An area of concentration is a group of courses with related content, which will enhance teaching in the elementary classroom. The area of concentration consists of a minimum of 15 semester hours.

Admission to the Professional component of the Teacher Education program is required. Transfer students who have completed the following admission requirements should apply at the time of initial enrollment. Classes in the Professional Program cannot be taken at a community college.
