The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is the general transfer degree that partners well with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. degree may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and requirements for specific majors at four-year institutions. The elective hours within the A.A. degree allow students to complete additional general education and lower level major courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 60 credit hours; please see JCCC A.A. degree requirements. **Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of courses.**

The B.S. in Fashion Studies offers two specializations: Fashion Business and Fashion Design.

Career opportunities in fashion design, fashion business, product development, merchandising, and retail management.

- Up to half of the credits required for a four-year degree may be completed at accredited two-year
 colleges. The B.S. in Fashion Studies requires 120 semester credit hours; 60 semester credit hours
 can be applied from accredited two-year colleges. More than 60 hours are listed below. Choose
 carefully.
- Each student must complete at least 30 hours of resident credit at K-State.
- A minimum of 45 hours must be at a course level of 300 or higher.
- Students must complete 20 of the last 30 hours of resident credit at K-State.
- Letter grades are required. Courses with "pass" or "credit" in lieu of letter grade can apply only as unrestricted electives.
- Grades of "C" or higher are required in all "Professional Studies" courses.
- Effective Fall 2024: Students transferring to K-State, with an AA, AFA or AS degree from JCCC will be considered to have satisfied K-State Core general education curriculum.
- Effective Fall 2024: Students who transfer to K-State, without completing AA, AFA or AS degree will have courses evaluated on a course-by-course basis toward meeting K-State requirements.
