The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners well with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and lower division requirements for a bachelor's degree at four-year institutions. The 30 hours of electives within the A.A. allow students to complete additional general education and lower division courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 60 credit hours; please see [JCCC A.A. degree requirements](#). The maximum number of hours from a community college that will be applied toward a bachelor's degree at most four-year schools is between 60 and 64 credit hours or 50% of the degree.

Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of appropriate courses.

- A major in the history of art is available to candidates for the B.F.A. degree. This major combines a 30-hour concentration in art history with 17 hours of studio training (beyond the 13 hours of foundation courses). A total of 120 hours is required for the degree, including 45 junior/senior hours (courses numbered 300 or higher). 30 of these 45 junior/senior hours must be taken in residence at the University of Kansas.
- In addition to completing the online application for KU Admission, [a portfolio and responses to three short essay questions](#) are required for admission to the Department of Visual Art. Information regarding these additional application materials can be found at <https://art.ku.edu/undergraduate-admissions>.
- All entering students in Visual Arts are required to participate in a foundation curriculum offered through the Foundations program before enrolling in advanced art or design studio courses. Students complete Drawing I, Drawing II, Art Concepts & Practice, Art Principles & Practice, and Visual Art Seminar (13 hours) before enrolling in advanced art or design studio courses.
- **NOTE:** Classes may count for a major requirement and a core requirement but may **NOT** count for 2 different core requirements.

**It is the STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY to check for updates to all transfer information. This transfer guide is provided as a service and is updated as needed. Degree requirements at the four-year colleges are subject to change by those institutions. To ensure you have the most accurate up to date information about the program, it is imperative you meet with an advisor at the transfer institution.**
