



- The School of Business offers a Bachelor of Science in Business degree with eight majors available: Accounting, Business Administration, Business Analytics, Finance, Information Systems, Marketing, Management and Leadership, and Supply Chain Management. In addition to the eight majors, the school offers nine 15-credit-hour minors: Business Analytics, Information Systems, International Business, Human Resource Management, Entrepreneurship, Marketing, Management and Leadership, Professional Selling, or Supply Chain Management.
- Each major consists of the following components: general education courses, business foundation classes, international dimension requirement, major courses, and advanced business electives to satisfy requirements of specific majors, minors, and certificates.
- The KU undergraduate business programs are offered in a traditional classroom-based format on the Lawrence campus, with very few options for evening or online courses.
- Students must first apply to the University of Kansas. Indicate a business major on the application to KU. Applications to the University of Kansas may be obtained online at [admissions.ku.edu](http://admissions.ku.edu), or through the KU Office of Admissions. Students should request official transcripts from all colleges and universities they have attended be sent directly to the KU Office of Admissions.

Transfer students who meet the requirements below will be admitted to the School of Business. Transfer students who indicate a business major on their application to KU but do not meet the requirements will be given a pre-business interest code as a College of Liberal Arts & Sciences student. These students will then be eligible to apply for the School of Business when they meet the minimum requirements below.

- Sophomore standing (30 credit hours)
- Completion of three pre-admission foundation courses (must be taken for a grade)
  - ACCT 200 – Financial Accounting 1
  - BSAN 202 – Statistics
  - ECON 142 – Principles of Microeconomics
- Cumulative GPA of 2.5+, including the following:
  - Overall GPA (all transfer coursework)
  - Overall Professional GPA (all transfer business coursework, including ECON)
- All foundation business courses must be taken for a grade.
- Students may only use courses with a grade of “C” or higher to fulfill requirements. Courses with the grade of “D” or “F” will still be included in the overall GPA for admission but will not satisfy requirements.
- KU and the School of Business will honor the repeat course policies at JCCC.
- MATH, PSYC, ENGL, IDR, non-business electives, and KU Core courses can be taken with a grade of pass/credit.
- Only students meeting all of the above requirements at the time of application will be considered for admission to the School of Business.
- A student may apply a total of 64 hours of community college coursework to KU. Students that complete the A.A. at JCCC meet the KU Core Goals 1-3. Students with more than 64 hours of community college coursework cannot apply the hours toward the 120-hour graduation requirement. Students are required to complete 45 credit hours of junior/senior level coursework to satisfy graduation requirements. At least 30 hours of junior/senior professional course work must be completed at KU (courses in residence) for the student to be eligible for graduation.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Demonstrate “4th level” proficiency in a foreign language (ASL courses may be used to meet requirement); <b>OR</b></li> <li>• Earn 6 credits in a KU or JCCC Study Abroad program; <b>OR</b></li> <li>• Earn 6 credits in IDR-approved courses; <b>OR</b></li> <li>• Earn 3 credits in a KU or JCCC Study Abroad program <b>AND</b> 3 credits in an IDR-approved course</li> </ul>

**KU Core Requirements** The KU Core comprises three general education goals and three advanced education goals. The general education goals are best met early in a student’s career. The advanced education goals are most appropriately acquired using the foundation of knowledge gained from the general education goals and progression through the major. Courses can be used to satisfy one Core goal at a time but may satisfy a major requirement and a core goal. Students that complete the A.A. at JCCC meet the KU Core Goals 1-3. Notes:

- It is **NOT** recommended that students take ENGL 122 at JCCC as KU requires an upper-level Business Writing course (KU Core Goal GE 2.1).
- It is **NOT** recommended that students take COMS 121 at JCCC, who want to major in Business at KU Lawrence. The School of Business at KU Lawrence requires all business students to take an upper division business speaking course (COMS 322) that will satisfy the KU Core Goal GE 2.2 and is a major requirement.
- However, if students take COMS 121 to complete their Associate degree requirements, then COMS 121 will count as an elective towards a KU Business degree.
