Teacher Education Unified Early Childhood

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The bachelor's degree in **unified early childhood** teacher education at the University of Kansas School of Education prepares individuals to work in inclusive settings to meet the learning needs of all young children (birth - grade three), including those with disabilities.

- Transfer requirements: Students will be admitted to the Unified Early Childhood Education program (from another institution or academic program) if they are admitted to KU with a minimum 2.75 GPA and declare Unified Early Childhood Education as their major. Click [here](#) to apply for transfer admission to KU through the Office of Admission.
- Transition Point #1: Progression to the Professional Block 1 requires that all Pre-Professional coursework is completed with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75. Must consult with a SOEHS advisor before entering the Professional Block. Students must complete the following: • Declare intent to continue in teacher education program and enter the professional sequence. • Earn a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.75. • Clear a criminal background check prior to placement in schools. • Respond to Question(s). • Submit two letters of reference (optional). • Administrative review of GPA in Prerequisite Courses. Students must have 2.50 GPA in the KU Core Curriculum and General Education courses. • Administrative review of dispositions for any concerns.

- The KU UEC program is a five-semester program and begins in the spring semester.
- Because of the sequential nature of the program, some classes necessary to progress are only offered at KU in the spring of the sophomore year. Students should plan to begin taking classes at KU during this term.
- A student must earn at least a grade of "C" or higher in COMS 130, ENGL 101, English and Mathematics admission requirements. A grade lower than a "C" is not acceptable in any teacher education course. Some programs may have additional minimum grade point requirements for specific classes. Consult School of Education & Human Sciences advisors for details.
- Sixty-four credits may be transferred to KU from community colleges. Students should be aware that 45 junior/senior credit hours are required for completion of the bachelor's degree; 30 of those hours must be at KU; and community college courses do not transfer as junior/senior hours.
- Only 6 hours of Credit/No Credit is allowed before a student is admitted into the School of Education and Human Sciences. Once admitted, a student cannot take a class Credit/No Credit for any program requirement.
- Minimum total hours for graduation is 120.

KU Core Requirements The KU Core comprises three general education goals and three advanced education goals. The general education goals are best met early in a student's career. The advanced education goals are most appropriately acquired using the foundation of knowledge gained from the general education goals and progression through the major. Courses can be used to satisfy one Core goal at a time but may satisfy a major requirement and a core goal. All KU Core Goal requirements will be fulfilled by program requirements.
