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The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners well with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and lower division requirements for a bachelor's degree at four-year institutions. The elective hours within the A.A. allows students to complete additional general education and lower division courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 60 credit hours, the maximum number of hours from a community college that will be applied toward a bachelor's degree at most four-year schools. **Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of appropriate courses.**

- Students who wish to transfer to MNU must apply at MNU.edu/apply.
- If students have completed an AA or AS degree, they are only required to fulfill the Faith Integration area of the general education requirements. All other general education requirements are considered met.
- Certain majors may require specific classes in the general education core. Students should check the major's specific section of the [current MNU catalog](#) for requirements or contact admissions@mnu.edu for assistance in obtaining a preliminary evaluation of their credits or connecting with faculty.
- Upper-division credit will NOT be given for lower division courses that are transferred in as equivalents to upper division courses.
- Courses from the Learning Center, Academic Achievement Center, and Learning Strategies will not transfer to MNU. These courses are considered remedial or developmental. With special approval from the Academic Success Center at MNU, required developmental courses at MNU could be waived with satisfactory completion of courses from these areas. No college credit will be granted for these courses.
