The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners well with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students who transfer to UCM with an Associate of Arts degree are considered to have met all 42 hours of UCM's General Education requirements, with the exception of Major/Minor-Required General Education courses and the Constitution Requirement. The elective hours within the A.A. allow students to complete additional general education and lower division courses required for specific majors/minors.

Students who transfer to UCM without a degree (or a degree other than an AA) will have all coursework evaluated on a course-by-course basis. JCCC students not completing the AA degree should refer to the tables in the <a href="https://linear.com/linear.

NOTE: Courses taken to fulfill General Education requirements may not be taken on the pass/fail basis.

**MODERN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT (6-9 hours)** The modern language requirement is fulfilled by successfully completing nine semester hours of one modern language, or completing six hours of one modern language and three hours of modern literature in translation (<u>ENGL 2220</u> or <u>ML 2000</u>), or completing three hours of an upper-level (or level three) modern language course.
