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The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners well with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and lower division requirements for a bachelor's degree at four-year institutions. The elective hours within the A.A. allow students to complete additional general education and lower division courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 60 credit hours. The Wichita State Bachelor of Business Administration degree requires completion of 120 credit hours; 60 credit hours must be completed at a four-year institution. **Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of appropriate courses.**

General Education Requirements for Wichita State University:

Effective Fall 2020, with AA/AS exceptions noted below, students must complete 36 credit hours of general education requirements as part of the WSU bachelor's degree. At least nine hours of the 36 credit hours must be numbered 300 or above. One course from the student's major area may be used toward general education requirements. The 36 credit hours are divided as follows:

- 12 credit hours: Four Foundation Courses (grade of C- or better)
ENGL 100 or ENGL 101; COMM 111; ENGL 102; MATH 111, MATH 112 or MATH 131 (Business Majors must take MATH 111 or MATH 112)
 - 12 credit hours: One course from each of the four Academic Divisions
Fine Arts, Humanities, Social/Behavioral Sciences, Mathematics and Natural Sciences
 - 12 credit hours: Four courses chosen from at least two of the four Academic Divisions above. One course must be a first-year seminar, if required.
- NOTE: General education requirements vary by major.

Frank Barton School of Business Prerequisites:

The following prerequisites must be met to enroll in upper-division courses in W. Frank Barton School of Business:

- Declared major in the W. Frank Barton School of Business
- 60 hours; 2.25 GPA

WSU Transfer Students Should Remember:

- **Graduation Requirements:** To qualify for graduation with a WSU bachelor's degree, transfer students must meet certain requirements such as course credit hours, levels, GPA, and residency. - **WSU Transfer Policy – Credit Acceptance:** It is the policy of Wichita State University (WSU) to accept all credits – with the exception of remedial coursework – earned at a post- secondary institution accredited by one of the U.S. regional accrediting agencies. Each academic college or department within WSU determines how those credits apply toward a particular degree program. Sometimes there can be a significant difference between what transfers and what counts toward a degree, especially if the courses are vocational in nature.
- **WSU Transfer Policy – AA/AS Degrees:** Students transferring to WSU with an AA or AS degree from a Kansas public community college will be considered to have satisfied WSU’s general education curriculum provided that they successfully complete, at WSU (with a grade of C- or better), two general education courses numbered 300 or above. These two courses must be in two separate divisions or subject areas. Students must also complete the WSU or WSU-equivalent Foundation courses with a grade of C- or better.
Note: Students completing JCCC courses equivalent to the full WSU general education curriculum are not required to complete the two above-mentioned general education courses numbered 300 or above at WSU.
- Students who transfer to WSU without completing AA or AS degree: Courses will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis toward meeting WSU requirements.
- Note: While JCCC courses equivalent to WSU courses numbered 300 or above may count toward the required nine hours of general education numbered 300 or above, they do not count toward the 45 credit hours of upper-division requirement. All students are also required to complete the WSU or WSU-equivalent Foundation courses with a grade of C- or better.
