The content from deactivated courses is being absorbed into other edited and new courses. The business Mathematics course is being removed from the Interior Staging Certificate. Theresa McChesney asked why the Kitchen & Bath Design Certificate requires a high number of total hours. Darla answered that the accrediting body/affiliation requires certain content, which can only be accomplished by requiring 54 credit hours.
