Employment of electricians is projected to grow 9 percent from 2016 to 2026, about as fast as the average for all occupations. As homes and businesses require more wiring, electricians will be needed to install the necessary components. Most electricians learn through an apprenticeship, but some start out by attending a technical school. Most states require electricians to be licensed.
