The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners well with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and lower division requirements for a bachelor's degree at four-year institutions. The elective hours within the A.A. allow students to complete additional general education and lower division courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 60 credit hours, the maximum number of hours from a community college that will be applied toward a bachelor's degree at most four-year schools. **Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of appropriate courses.**

- 1) The School of Business at Emporia State University offers majors in Accounting, Business Administration, Business Data Analytics, Business Education, Computer Science, Information Systems, Management, and Marketing. On campus programs are geared towards the traditional students with daytime courses and only a few evening courses.
- 2) The School of Business at Emporia State University Kansas City (Overland Park) offers majors in Accounting and Business Administration. Courses are offered in a combination of evening courses and online courses during the traditional ESU fall, spring and summer semesters. Fall and spring weeknight courses meet once a week. Summer courses are taught online only.
- 3) Students must complete a minimum of 51 credit hours prior to taking ESU courses, including Composition I, Composition II, Accounting I, Accounting II, Managerial Accounting, Microeconomics, Macroeconomics, Intro to Business, Public Speaking, College Algebra OR Calculus, and Introduction to Microcomputer Applications.
- 4) Graduation Requirements:
 - o 120 semester hours (minimum) are required for this degree.
 - o 60 hours must be completed at a four-year school.
 - o Cumulative GPA of 2.35. Graduates must also have a cumulative GPA of 2.35 in the business core.
 - All students must have at least 45 hours of credit in courses numbered 300 or above from a fouryear school.
 - At least 50% of the business credit hours required for a business degree must be earned at ESU.
 - Residency Requirements can be met in one of two ways: 1) Earn a total of 75 hours of resident credit, of which 6 must be within the final 12 hours <u>OR</u> 2) Earn 30 of the final 45 hours in residence, of which 6 of the final 12 hours must be in residence.
- 5) Admission requirements for the School of Business and current tuition rates may be viewed at https://www.emporia.edu/business/. Applications to Emporia State University may be obtained online at https://www.emporia.edu/admissions/apply. Students should request official transcripts from all colleges and universities they have attended to be sent directly to the ESU Admissions Office.
- 6) Through a consortium agreement, it is possible to receive financial aid based on a combination of enrolled hours. Students concurrently enrolled in courses at ESU and JCCC can contact the Financial Aid, Scholarships & Veterans Office for more information regarding the consortium agreement.
