The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners well with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and lower division requirements for a bachelor's degree at four-year institutions. The 30 hours of electives within the A.A. allow students to complete additional general education and lower division courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 60 credit hours. Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of appropriate courses.

- The College of Business Administration offers majors in Accounting, Business Administration, Business Administration (BSBA), Entrepreneurship and Innovation, Finance, Management (emphasis in Organizational Management, Human Resources Management, Operations and Supply Chain Management,) Management Information Systems, Marketing, and Professional Strategic Selling. Certificates in Business of Sports and Entertainment, Data Analytics, Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Belonging in Business, International Business, Investment Management, Marketing Technology, and Professional Strategic Selling are also offered. The College of Business also offers minors in Business (for non-business majors), Entrepreneurship and Innovation, and Management.
- A minimum of 120 credit hours are required for an undergraduate bachelor's degree in the College of Business.
- The KSU College of Business Administration has adopted a Business Administration Pre-Professions (BAPP) designation for all entering students. Completion of 45 credit hours (both transfer and K-State hours) in this program with a K-State GPA of at least 2.5 is required before the student will be admitted into one of the degree tracks (majors).
- Transfer students (those coming to K-State who have earned any credit hours since high school graduation) must have a 2.5 transfer GPA to be admitted to the College of Business. Transfer students must achieve a K-State GPA of 2.5 or higher on the first 15 or more hours of K-State course work to be able to continue in the College of Business and enter into a degree track. (Transfer coursework to KSU College of Business Administration carrying a grade of D will not be accepted toward a student's business degree requirements.)
- Transfer students with more than 60 hours MUST declare a major after their first 15 hours at K-State.
- A maximum of 60 credit hours from a community college will be applied toward the bachelor's degree.

Business students must complete 16 credit hours of K-State 8 coursework outside the College of Business Administration. The Natural and Physical Sciences course must include a lab. Remaining K-State 8 requirements will be met through other general and business core requirements. A minimum of four different course prefixes must be represented to fulfill K-State 8 requirements.

Transfer students are required to cover all eight of the K-State areas. To access information on designated courses for each area, see General Education: K-State 8. Courses equivalent to K-State 8 courses in the designated areas may be transferred to satisfy area requirements.

Transfer students are also encouraged to sign up for K-State's DirectLink Program, which provides them with a K-State College of Business Academic Advisor to work with them during their community college career to ensure they are up-to-date on curriculum changes and their courses align directly with our requirements.

It is the STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY to check for updates to all transfer information. This transfer guide is provided as a service and is updated as needed. Degree requirements at the four-year colleges are subject to change by those institutions. To ensure you have the most accurate up to date information about the program, it is imperative you meet with an advisor at the transfer institution.
