 - Apply for admission, including \$20 application fee (non-refundable). Complete the application online at <u>www.washburn.edu/admissions</u>
 - Send official transcripts of all previous college work to: Washburn University / Office of Admissions 1700 SW College / Topeka, KS 66621
 - Academic good standing; minimum cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0.
- <u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: Students must also apply and be admitted into the School of Nursing. Please contact the School of Nursing for its admission requirements.

• Requirements for Bachelor's Degree:

- Minimum of 120 semester hours of credit.
- Minimum of 60 semester hours from Washburn or a four-year college or university; at least 30 hours must be completed through Washburn.
- Minimum of 45 semester hours of credit from courses at the upper division level.
- Minimum of 84 graded hours.
- Grade of "C" or better in courses counting toward the university requirements and toward the major.
